Ovarian Cancer

Ovarian cancer is a tumour that develops in the ovaries.



There's no screening programme for ovarian cancer, visit your GP as soon as something doesn't feel right or you have one of the symptoms.

Symptoms

Ovarian cancer symptoms include frequently (roughly 12 or more times a month) having:



- No appetite or feeling full quickly after eating
- An urgent need to pee or needing to pee more often
- A swollen tummy or feeling bloated
- Pain or tenderness in your tummy or the area between the hips (pelvis)





There are three simple tests to help diagnose ovarian cancer.



- Blood tests CA125
- Ultrasound scan
- Taking a sample of tissue called a biopsy

Ovarian cancer kills more women a year than the other four gynae cancers combined
